"Hit the Deck" Homework:

(Did ye holler from atop the crow's nest of your vessels because of this past week's homework assignments?!?)

Spelling cards are due Tuesday this upcoming week. (They will be in the shape of fish and can be caught by your sailor's homemade fishing pole!)

The "Nautical Homework Loxodograph" will also be distributed on Tuesday of next week and should always be located on the "Bring Back" side of the homework folder. The packet is always due the following Monday with one reading summary written in the kiddo's composition book (or on an attached paper).

Please help your "swimming turtles" keep up with this as it is part of their Reading grade.

Make sure to check your child's homework and initial the log (recommended daily homework) after your child has completed their homework. (--Even if it is done in the After Care Program.)



"Ship Shape" Home Folders:

It is extremely important to check and clean out your child's home folder each night. The papers on the "Keep at Home" side <u>need to be taken out on a daily basis</u>. The papers on the "Bring Back" side need to be <u>completed and/or returned the next day</u> (or in some cases, ASAP). I really appreciate your support in helping keep the "crew members" organized!!



"Mighty Seas "Math Homework:

Each night, the Math Homework will be a review of that day's concept. This is a follow-up of that day's lesson and your child should be able to complete this on their own or with minimal help. They will only be required to complete either the even numbers or the odd numbers (about 10 problems). Please check for neatness and reversed numbers. The homework page needs to be returned the next day.

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Fact Fluency is an "on your own at home, with or without someone else" activity. This may involve 5 minutes of playing a math game, using basic math flash cards, playing card games, verbally calling out math problems, counting out "chore money," telling time on a face clock vs. a digital clock, utilizing a timed math sheet, counting how many fish there really are in the sea... and the list goes on! Incorporating this for 5 minutes a night will only help keep their basic addition, subtraction, multiplication, clock work and money management up to par.
